Hallye Bone, a St. Louis native, has been quilting since 1967. A former high school English teacher, she's been teaching quilting since 1980. Her work for the Smithsonian Institution, Quilt National, and her 30-plus year quilt repair business created her collection of vintage quilts. It also led her to become certified by the American Quilter's Society in Paducah, KY, as an appraiser of quilted textiles. She began writing for quilting magazines "Miniature Quilts," "Quilting Today," "Quilt World", and designing for "Creative Quilting Magazine" while she lived in Houston, Texas. She has a series of original redwork and applique patterns. Hallye travels extensively, lecturing and teaching, and she teaches regularly at several St. Louis quilt shops. Her lecture style has been described as informative, entertaining, humorous and down-to-earth. She is extremely knowledgeable about her subjects.
